Dear Ms Cloutier:

I have attached a letter from the Taxpayer Advocate. It shows that Nader did not contact the IRS until March 7. Please note that Nader was hired to negotiate with the IRS of February 25 and on March 4 his associate, Polubinski, was instructed by me to advise the IRS that payment would be forthcoming within a few days. Also, note that there was no seizure order for ComPol, as stated by both Polubinski and Nader.

My complaint is not for ethics violations or malpractice; it is a criminal complaint. Polubinski and Nader deliberately deceived me into believing that I had to file for bankruptcy to save my company. It was their intention to take as much of the company assets as possible. They had no intention of providing legal services. As they proceeded with their confidence game, they made sure that they covered their tracks and made it appear that I had hired them for the purpose of filing for bankruptcy. It was because I had confidence in their honesty that I did not require everything in writing. If they had made the call, as instructed, I would still have my company today.

I am not a criminal investigator. I have no skills in criminal investigation. I do not know how to interrogate a criminal suspect. Investigations of this type should be conducted by skilled professionals. Before you contact me again, I want to know your credentials. What law enforcement and criminal investigation courses have you taken? Do you have a degree in law enforcement? For what police departments have you worked? How many cases have you investigated that were successfully prosecuted?
